A DNA sequence encoding the Influenza A virus (A/Puerto Rico/8/1934(H1N1)) neuraminidase (P03468.2) (Met1-Lys454) was expressed, the cell lysates are collected, and bio-activity was tested.

Measured by its ability to cleave a fluorogenic substrate, 2'-(4-Methylumbelliferyl)- α -D-N-acetylneuraminic acid The specific activity is > 150 U

One unit is defined as the amount of enzyme required to cleave 1 nmole of 2'-(4-Methylumbelliferyl)- α -D-N-acetylneuraminic acid per minute at pH 7.5 at 37°C.

Endotoxin

< 1.0 EU per μg of the protein as determined by the LAL method

Stability

Samples are stable for up to twelve months from date of receipt at -70 °C

Molecular Mass

The recombinant influenza A H1N1 Neuraminidase comprises 454 amino acids and has a predicted molecular mass of 50.1 kDa.

Formulation

Lyophilized from sterile PBS, 1% Triton X-100, 5% Trehalose, 5% Mannitol, pH7.4

- 1. 5 % trehalose and mannitol are added as protectants before lyophilization.

Usage Guide

Storage

Store it under sterile conditions at -20°C to -80°C. It is recommended that the protein be aliquoted for optimal storage. Avoid repeated freeze-thaw cycles.

Reconstitution

Adding sterile water, prepare a stock solution of 0.25 mg/ml. Concentration is measured by UV-Vis.
